A Note about This Morning's Music - - by Sean Baran

Twila Paris is a prolific Christian music singer, songwriter, author, and pianist. Since 1980, she has released 22 albums and amassed 33 number one Christian Radio singles. She has been named the Gospel Music Association Female Vocalist of the Year three years in a row and was inducted into the Gospel Music Association Hall of Fame in May 2015. **He Is Exalted** comes from her 1985 album *Kingdom Seekers*. "He Is Exalted" is ranked at number 66 from CCM Magazine's 2006 book CCM Presents: The 100 Greatest Songs in Christian Music and *Kingdom Seekers* is ranked at number 57 on The 100 Greatest Albums in Christian Music. The song's simple text is equally powerful in its conviction of faith. The melody and words create a soaring mood, reminding us that God reigns above us all and is worthy of our fullest praise.
