New Testament Reading: Colossians 3:1-11

If then you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. ² Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth. ³ For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. ⁴ When Christ who is your life appears, then you also will appear with him in glory.

⁵ Put to death therefore what is earthly in you: sexual immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry. ⁶ On account of these the wrath of God is coming. ⁷ In these you too once walked, when you were living in them. ⁸ But now you must put them all away: anger, wrath, malice, slander, and obscene talk from your mouth. ⁹ Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have put off the old self with its practices ¹⁰ and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge after the image of its creator. ¹¹ Here there is not Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave, free; but Christ is all, and in all.

Now after the Sabbath, toward the dawn of the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb. ² And behold, there was a great earthquake, for an angel of the Lord descended from heaven and came and rolled back the stone and sat on it. ³ His appearance was like lightning, and his clothing white as snow. ⁴ And for fear of him the guards trembled and became like dead men. ⁵ But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. ⁶ He is not here, for he has risen, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay. ⁷ Then go quickly and tell his disciples that he has risen from the dead, and behold, he is going before you to Galilee; there you will see him. See, I have told you." ⁸ So they departed quickly from the tomb with fear and great joy, and ran to tell his disciples. ⁹ And behold, Jesus met them and said, "Greetings!" And they came up and took hold of his feet and worshiped him. ¹⁰ Then Jesus said to them, "Do not be afraid; go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee, and there they will see me."

¹¹ While they were going, behold, some of the guard went into the city and told the chief priests all that had taken place. ¹² And when they had assembled with the elders and taken counsel, they gave a sufficient sum of money to the soldiers ¹³ and said, "Tell people, 'His disciples came by night and stole him away while we were asleep.' ¹⁴ And if this comes to the governor's ears, we will satisfy him and keep you out of trouble." ¹⁵ So they took the money and did as they were directed. And this story has been spread among the Jews to this day.

A Note about This Morning's Music - - by Sean Baran

Spirituals come in two styles - laments and jubilees. This morning's prelude is a lament, which is a slower and more dramatic expression of faith. One of the most persecuted and unjustly abused populations in the United States of America gave us music that demonstrates true faith in Jesus and constant hope that there is a better day to be had in this world. While they could have turned their back on the messages contained in the Bible, this population held firm in their belief. For that reason, I always perform and listen to spirituals with a deep awe at the expression emanating from the powerful texts and moving melodies. - Sean

Assistant Director – The Cellar (Afterschool Program)

JOB DESCRIPTION (part time)



The Cellar is an afterschool outreach ministry for high school students (grades 9-12). It is located in the basement of the First Presbyterian Church of Pittsburgh, 320 Sixth Avenue in downtown Pittsburgh. The Cellar is open each *Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from 3-6 pm.* An average of 50 students attend each session. Most of the students come to us from two downtown high schools: *Urban Pathways 6-12* and *City Charter High School*, though we have drawn from as many as 28 different high schools. While at The Cellar, students can get a free snack, play video games, pool, foosball, basketball, create arts/crafts, play board games, or just chat with friends. It is a safe hangout space where teens can learn about who Jesus is and the role He can play in their lives.



General Description:

The Assistant Director of The Cellar works with the Director to ensure the success of the program. He/she assists, when requested, with organizing program activities, preparing food/snacks, and monitoring and disciplining students (when necessary). This is a very hands-on position. The Assistant Director has direct contact with the student participants. In the Director's absence, the Assistant Director must be prepared to step in and take overall responsibility for running the program.



Character and Experience:

The *Assistant Director* must be a mature follower of Jesus Christ and have a passion to share His plan for mankind with the students on a one-to-one or group basis, as opportunities arise. He/she must also have a thorough understanding of urban teenagers and have a heart to serve them. Previous experience in ministry to urban youth is preferred.



Days/Hours: This is a 12-hour per week position: Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from 2:00 pm – 6:00 pm. This includes time for food and activity preparation before the doors are opened.

Supervision:

This position reports to the Director of The Cellar.








- Assist the Director with the cooking /baking of food items using the Cellar kitchenette or commercial kitchen, as needed.
- Assist with the setup of packaged snack areas in the kitchenette, hot entrees and beverages (as applicable).
- Greet students (warmly and with enthusiasm) as they arrive.
- Ensure that each student signs in upon arrival and that a complete and legible student data form is available for each student. (If the student is a first-time participant, provide the student with a form to complete).
- Monitor the students in the program area, hallways and restroom entrances and correct student behavior as needed.
- Review the "Rules of the Cellar" with all new participants.
- Contact parents, when necessary, to confirm student data.
- Assist with food/beverage distribution to students.
- Perform other duties, as needed, at the request of the Director.
